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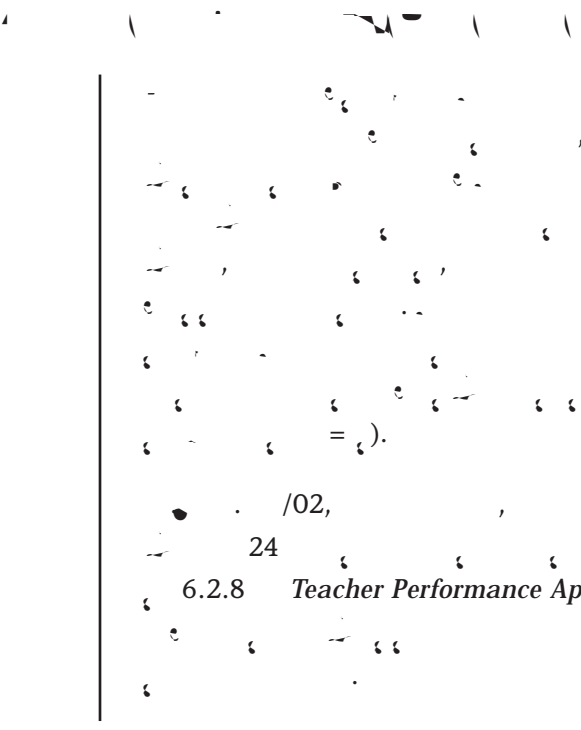




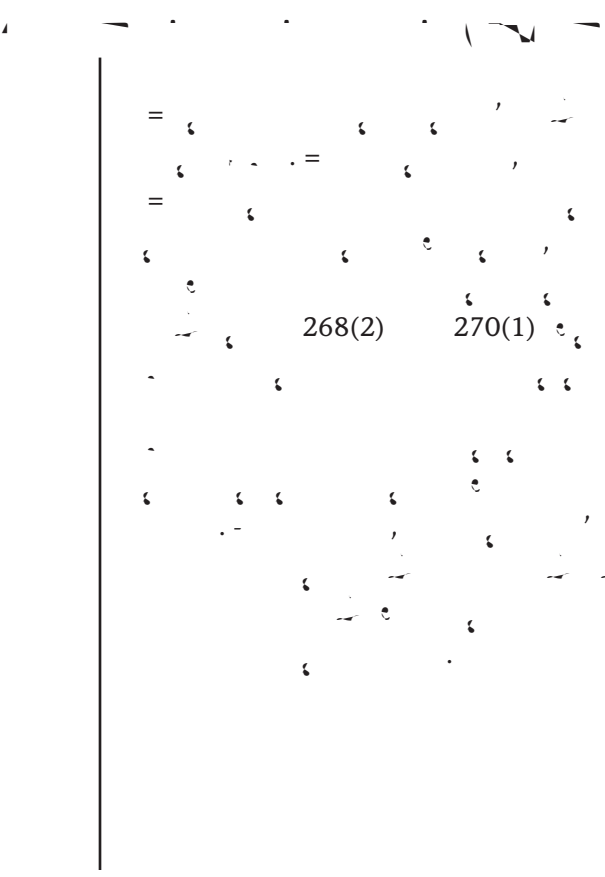








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### 2.2.1 Teacher Training Outside of Ontario
